Thank you for your interest in Free Press. As always, we are eager to answer your questions and provide your office with any information about the work our nonprofit, nonpartisan organization undertakes to improve our media.

As you know, Free Press and Free Press Action Fund do not accept gifts from the government, political parties or businesses. Both organizations are supported by individuals, private foundations, and public charities. In 2010, Free Press received 164 contributions totaling \$4,291,484, an average donation of \$19,685. In 2010 Free Press Action Fund received 7,249 contributions totaling \$432,499, an average donation of \$59.66.

In response to your specific request in your letter dated November 15, a list of Free Press' top 10 donors for the most recent fiscal year is presented below. In order to be responsive to your specific request, this list includes the names of some donors who, as is their right and privilege, require specific approval prior to Free Press' publication of their names. One donor chose to exercise its right to privacy.
